The CHIME International CIO Summit is held twice a year at the Møller Institute in Cambridge, UK. The Summit brings together digital health leaders from across the UK and beyond to educate, support and inspire. Blending actionable and up-to-date education with networking and wellbeing, the Summit gives delegates the skills they need to continue to make an impact in their roles.

Education

The CHIME International CIO Summit is taught by a faculty of international CIOs, thought leaders and experienced NHS CIOs and CCIOs. Delegates sharpen their organisational skills and strategies to lead with impact, they understand the huge potential of digital health and they work on their own personal impact and influence. The intense education and networking allow all delegates to build enduring professional relationships and networks.

Curriculum

CHIME's curriculum has been developed over more than 20 years of teaching and is proven to support digital health leaders to:

- Lead organisations: understand the potential of digital health to bring about sustainable change
- Lead people: direct change programmes with impact and manage distributed teams
- Lead self: develop self-awareness about one's role at work and in the wider organisation and informal networks

Success Factors

CHIME's curriculum has six modules, known as 'Success Factors'. These are the six areas we have identified as core to a successful digital health leader's skillset.

They are:

- Setting vision and strategy
- Leading transformational change
- Building high-performing teams
- Achieving organisational change
- Consumerism
- Networks and communities

Supplementary modules:

- Leadership communications
- The prepared leader
- Less software, more data
- Life balance







Attendees & feedback

Attendees across previous Summits:

19% of the delegates were from National Leadership (NHS England, Health Education England)

77% of the delegates were from NHS Foundation Trust Hospitals and regional organisations

4% were from other healthcare organisations

80% were CIOs, CTOs, or Directors of Transformation 20% were in clinical digital roles such as CCIOs, CMIOs and CNIOs

The majority of delegates work for the NHS, however non-NHS digital leaders are also welcome to apply.
